Insights for Growth...

I had lunch recently with a ministry friend who shared and "Aha Moment" with me that I would like to share with you, mainly because it is so relevant to our current culture in which we minister. Also, until we can identify which of the categories each person occupies, we will struggle to fulfill The Great Commission, The Great Commandment and disciple others to do the same. It's about 4 types of individuals and each of us fit into one of them. It is vitally important that we understand how each fit into the Kingdom Work of Jesus Christ.

Spiritual Narcissist - Let's begin with the most prevalent type of person in today's American church. This person carries a great deal of head knowledge about all things Bible. He (she) can tell you how a church operates and in what order. They likely have a favorite Bible verse, a particular book of the Bible and even a favorite preacher. What they don't have is a love for those far from Jesus. This person believes that the church was designed for them. The music played is their favorite type of music. The style of preaching (and pastoring) they are accustomed to has the focus on them. This type is basically "At ease in Zion" as the saying goes. This type does not share Christ nor what God is doing in their life with others who may be encouraged by their faith walk. While this can be a young person coming straight out of a religious background, it is more likely a person that is age 45 or above, an empty nester, or possibly someone at or in retirement.

Numb & Indifferent - While this could be someone with a church membership, it is not because they attend frequently or support the church in any way. This person could also be the "Average loe or lane" that you work with, live across the street from, etc. He/she is overall, a good person - they just don't have a say about spiritual things. They are not interested in having spiritual discussion but won't mind talking sports or their children. Sunday is just another day - they deserve to do what they want on possibly their only day of rest. There is no specific age category for this type of person. They come in all ages, shapes and sizes.

Secular Spiritualist - This individual can be a real difference-maker. They are all about fighting for a cause whether it be about animal rights, women's rights, or equal rights - which are all noble causes. However, this person could more-so fall on the side of saving a whale than they would the unborn. Most in this category are going to be under the age of 40. They have been taught and had modeled, that it is all about doing the good deeds. Those is faith circles see it as social gospel and are very "cause" oriented. While all this noble, these deeds are being done outside of the umbrella of Christ. They have possibly grown up in church and that has left a bad taste in their mouth. They have seen

the spiritual narcissist and see through the hypocrisy and want to stand for something that leaves a mark - that shows that they passed through.

Kingdom Engager - Yes, you guessed it - these are the individuals that are taking God at his Word. Their "works" show that their faith is alive. These are the "true" difference makers! These guys talk about how Jesus is affecting their daily lives by sharing it with others through spiritual conversations as the Holy Spirit opens the door. They place their lives second and place God's agenda first. They are not all older in age, many of them are very young, BUT THEY GET IT.

As I close I just have a few questions: Reading over these 4 types of individuals, in which category do you fall? If it is not Kingdom Engager (and you are claiming Christ as King), what are you going to do to change? Let's fast forward ahead only one generation (approximately 25 years). What is your church going to look like? Will there be a place for those seeking a relationship with Christ? Will your church even be in existence if changes are not made to be more Kingdom focused?

As always, please accept my invitation to begin a conversation around these thoughts. As each month passes, more Holston churches are reaching out

to learn more about how they may become or remain viable is this swift changing culture. I look forward to speaking to you soon!


