Summer brings opportunities for a lot of outdoor fun. Just yesterday I saw an Asian family gathered at a local park, and found myself praying, "Lord, show us how to reach them!" As you enjoy ballgames, swimming, fishing, hiking, etc., notice the people around you and find out who they are, where they're from, and where they live. These questions open doors to share the gospel! Whether or not the people we see look or live like us, they all need Jesus. What will we do to reach them? Whatever specific approaches we use, fruitful evangelism opens the door for church planting. (Remember, we're not really church planting if we're not reaching people for Christ.)

I want to challenge you to consider church planting for three reasons:

- 1) Even with the large number of churches in our area, thousands of people are lost without Christ.
- 2) New churches reach more people.
- 3) Your church wouldn't exist if someone didn't plant it.

Even if your church isn't financially able to be the sole sponsor of a church plant, you can partner with one or more sister churches to begin a new work. Maybe your church doesn't see the need, but you do. What should you do? In either case, you should...
