TO YOUR HEALTH

Few health conditions are as painful and limiting as back problems. It seems that once back issues arise, they continue to get progressively worse. When a minister begins such a journey of deterioration we are so limited in ministry projects, fellowships, etc. Is there anything we can do to alleviate this issue?

Stretching is a significant practice that can help so much. Before you play golf, lift weights, play ball or do anything physical, take time to stretch. Stiff-legged toe touches really help. Sitting on the ground with our feet out in 90 degrees allows for some good stretches. Try walking your fingers along the floor straight out as far as possible. Let the fingers of both hands run along your left leg out to your toes and then on the right. Keep the knees as stiff as possible.

When you get up in the morning, go find a comfortable rug or carpet and lay flat on your back. Pull your knees to your chest, grab your shins and pull into your chest. Hold this pose for five seconds and release. Do a set of ten. It will start your day well and give your back some needed relief.

There are many yoga-type stretches you can search on Google that do not require the spiritual acceptance of yoga, but offer the benefits of good posturing and movement. As with anything physical, consult your physician before undertaking a new course of training. Taking care of our joints, muscles and ligaments is a wise investment. Enjoy!


