



### FBC BAILEYTON SPRING REVIVAL April 16 - 19 at 6:30 PM


We are being led by David Horton, President of Fruitland Bible College, Hendersonville, NC.





### TO YOUR HEALTH - FAILURE

Our nation is facing an epidemic of Type 2 Diabetes. There is not a conclusive explanation for this preventable disease. It seems to be a combination of genetics, inactivity, poor nutrition and a few other possibilities. It usually begins with slight elevation of blood glucose levels and then those levels continue to rise until they consistently cross a boundary of around 120. We know the usual consequences of Type 2 Diabetes: fatigue, neuropathy of the feet, kidney failure, blindness, urinary disorders, etc. One can take a day or two of careful eating to lower the blood glucose level, but you cannot cheat the A1C test that measures cumulative blood sugar over a three-month period. It is a tough battle.

Clergy seem to be a leading group in the struggle with diabetes. It is a high stress vocation that draws us into unhealthy social eating and too often hinders regular exercise. These are a bad recipe for good health. I had been on a good course for quite some time. I take a few medications that help and I try to be thoughtful about everything I eat, even snacks. However, as is common among people with Type 2 Diabetes, I fell off the wagon. After a while we get tired of not eating what others eat. We find a hunger for sugary foods. We miss dinner rolls and ice cream. After a meal we want the dessert everyone else eats. AND...we know what our glucose levels probably are so we avoid sticking our fingers and checking to truly know. It will only reveal our failure and the need to change. So, what is the answer?

People with Type 2 Diabetes have some choices to make. We must count carbohydrates and limit their consumption. Our bodies cannot process them for energy and the buildup has an unfortunate effect. It is necessary to check blood sugar levels daily. Fast food is almost always a bad health choice for diabetics. Following doctor's orders on medication and nutrition is essential. The greatest danger to diabetics may be how slow and subtle it progresses. It lulls the patient into doubting its dangers until a foot sore, optical issues or other effects lead to permanent consequences. We must stop ourselves, find accountability, and get back on the bandwagon. The Apostle Paul warned of the stomach becoming our god. Let's choose good health. We can do this!
