THINGS LEFT UNDONE

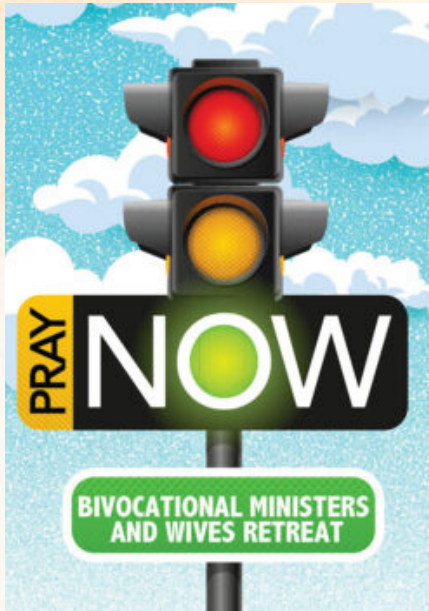
As I prepare for all the sights, smells, and joys of the holiday season, I find myself counting the time remaining in this year. If you're like me, you're thinking, "If I'm going to do it this year, I'd better hurry up!" I've had a similar thought process as I faced the upcoming birth of a child, a job transition, or relocation. Some of you are thinking this way in the face of retirement. The older we get the more we need to think these thoughts in light of eternity.

Two days ago, my wife received word that a friend's husband was found dead in their home, apparently the victim of a heart attack. He had retired only a short time ago. His exit was different than he or anyone else (except God) had planned. In fact, the personal end of life scenario that many of us imagine will be just that – imaginary. I'm not trying to be morose. I've simply been reminded that obedience is urgent. We don't serve a rainy-day Savior, so we shouldn't offer Him rainy-day discipleship. Christ calls us to every-day discipleship! There may be things that need to fall into place to fulfill certain parts of your journey, but if God has called you to do something He will certainly give you the tools and the opportunity.

So, whatever it is that you know you should have already done, here's your reminder. Daddy used to critique my nonchalant attitude as a child by saying, "Son, you act like the heavens are full of days and they're all coming your way!" Nobody said things quite like he did. He's with Jesus now, but I still hear those words ringing in my ears and prodding my adult self. Laziness, pride, and fear can be powerful deterrents, but they must fall at the realization of three words: Jesus. Is. Worthy!

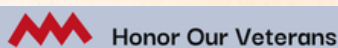

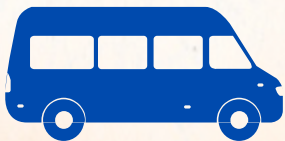

TO YOUR HEALTH DEVOTION IS THE ANSWER

Good health takes effort. Whether it is regular exercise, careful eating, medical check-ups or good oral care, it all requires a conscientious effort. Not only does it take intentionality to be successful, but it also requires discipline to say no to some things and yes to others.

I have two areas of my life that need discipline for my long term health. Both of them mean major adjustments in what I cannot eat. So many of us have similar needs because food has become incredibly important to us. We are often emotional eaters. I actually had an elderly man in my earlier days of ministry who shocked this young pastor. He had congestive heart failure and was on a salt-free diet. He told me that he was ignoring his doctor's strict orders because mashed potatoes and green beans were not the same without salt and he would rather die than give up those favorites! Most of us would not be so blunt, but our subtle actions and choices reflect the sentiment.

In my ongoing journey toward better health I have been challenged with this thought: rather than live a life of denial and frustration I choose to view my good choices as a devotion to God in caring for my "temple" for His glory and my lifelong ministry. This is a positive approach. This is a worshipful approach. The focus is not on my salivating over a dessert or my compulsion to skip a walk or a workout. Everything I do for better health is to bless my earthly shell in honor of God's gift. The switch in outlook has been huge for me.

If you want to shed some pounds for your heart, walk/hike to improve circulation, get your diabetes under control or just live healthier maybe you should change your health focus to an act of devotion to the One Who loves you so and calls you to impact your world. Just a thought... a good, healthy thought!
