Although our denomination has collected a special Christmas offering for foreign missions since 1888, the offering was named the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in 1918 (six year's after her death on December 24, 1912) to honor her sacrificial service as a missionary to China (1873-1912) and avid promoter of the cause of international missions.

LMCO 2023 Goal: \$200 Million

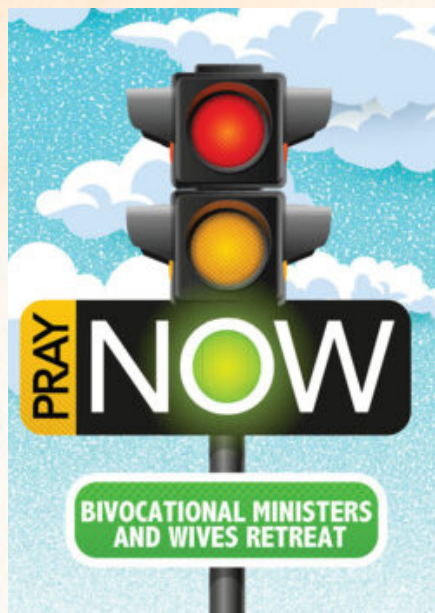

TO YOUR HEALTH

Reading Signs Along the Way

As we get older our conversations seem to gravitate more to health concerns. In fact, the medical numbers that we get from visiting the doctor tend to pop up more and more often in our discussions with friends and family. Some people are consumed with these statistics while others feign ignorance. What do they mean and what do we do with them? Here are a few of the more common ones.

Blood pressure reveals the effectiveness of the heart and circulatory system in maintaining healthy pressure in your arteries and veins. The top number is systolic pressure, or the blood pressure as the heart pumps. It varies according to the needs of the body for blood. The lower number is diastolic pressure, or the blood pressure when the heart is at rest between pumps. The latter tends to be considered more critical. The upper number should be around 120 but can rise a bit with age. The lower number typically falls between 75 and 85. If it rises significantly a course of action must be taken. When blood pressure gets out of control we are at much greater risk of heart attack or stroke (brain attack).

The heart rate is the amount of times the heart beats per minute. A healthy heart will beat approximately 72 times per minute when resting. Exercise can raise this rate well beyond 100 beats per minute. The healthier the heart, the lower the b/m can go. A regular runner can easily have a resting heart rate of less than 60 b/m. If your resting heart rate rises above 80 you should consult your physician as this means your heart is having to pump harder to circulate enough blood to fuel your body. Heart attacks usually result when the heart is in continual distress.

Blood glucose is determined by "sticking" ones finger and giving a drop to a meter that determines the amount of sugar/carbohydrates that remain in the blood unprocessed by the endocrine system of insulin. For a person with diabetes this information is critical to maintaining healthy levels and holding off many of the unfortunate effects of this debilitating disease. The purpose in taking these samples is to determine ones healthy eating habits. If this number is much over 120 then adjustments must be made in meals and snacks. Sadly, when a person is not choosing wisely they often avoid taking this simple test as it points out their deficiencies. But this practice is essential to finding a healthy way forward.

Most of us have bathroom scales for checking our weight. There are many reasons for subtle variations in our body weight. For this reason weighing each day is not a good choice. Checking ones weight a couple of times per week can alert us to unwanted trends. Healthy eating choices and staying hydrated with water can stabilize our weight. These check-ups can prove quite helpful in accomplishing good health goals.

Know the signs that are most impactful for your good health. Do you avoid them or manipulate them? Make them your "friends" to help you on a good journey of caring for your body, the earthly temple the Lord has given us.

- Will I Get Too Attached and Have to Say Goodbye?

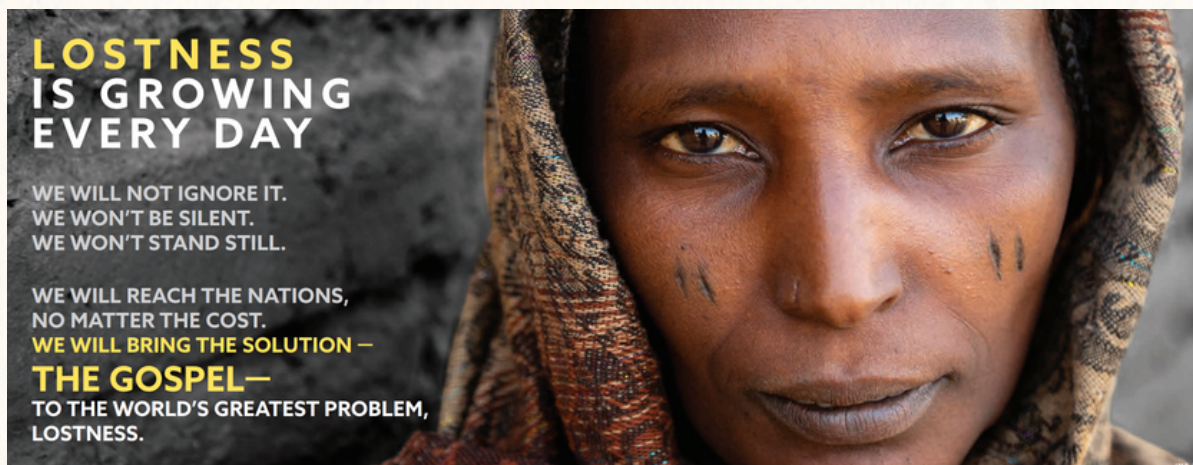
