Are you willing to do ministry in hard places? As we bemoan the lack of vitality and growth in many of our churches, we need to consider what we've done with the people God has already put near us. It's easy to give a laundry list of all the societal failures around us; wading in and walking against the current of those failures is difficult. We have recently begun conversations with Johnson City Housing Authority concerning how we can help them and bring the gospel with us. They manage over 700 units with over 1,000 adults and more than 600 children. These adults include people who have aged out of the foster system, disabled veterans, single parents, recovering addicts, and more. They're no different than many of the people near you; they just live close together. While it's good to pick these people up and take them to church (and we ultimately want to see them become fruit-bearing members of our churches), we don't want to miss opportunities to meet them where they are - to say "I love you!" more loudly than "I want to fix you!"

We have money earmarked for inner city ministry, but we need your help! We can take the kind of ministry that's already being done through our Johnson City Baptist Center and share it in new locations, but more ministry requires more volunteers. No matter what age group you are most gifted to serve, there are people who need your servant's heart to point them to God's saving grace through Jesus Christ. If you need on the job training, our JCBC director, Anna Huggins (anna@holstonba.org), would be glad to introduce you to ongoing opportunities. If you would like to minister in a similar setting in another city near you, we would love to help you get started.

We simply cannot sit idly by as the world perishes. As we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, the world needs to know why it even matters. The fields are white unto harvest. Let's put our boots on and go gather the Lord's harvest!

- ⁷ Create the necessary communications with the HBA churches, committees, and ministry teams (newsletters, calendars, books of reports, announcements, etc.).
- ⁷ Serve as the primary communicator regarding maintenance for all HBA properties and reservations for the HBA Mission House.
- ^r Oversee the submission of the Annual Church Profile, including promotion, reminders, and assisting church clerks.
- ⁷ Update the HBA website and social media page(s) as needed.

APPALACHIAN TRAIL HIKER'S MINISTRY

The annual Holston Baptist Association's Appalachian Trail Hiker's Worship Service & Cook Out will be in Erwin at the Chestoa Picnic area on the Nolichucky River on May 5. The Worship Service will begin at 11 am with the cook out picnic immediately following at 12 to around 3. There are several ways for churches and individuals to be involved in this ministry opportunity. One way is to help provide food for the picnic lunch. This year our main food will be pizza made by Opie's Pizza food truck. Churches can bring side dishes (in disposable aluminum pans). Anything will be greatly appreciated. Some ideas to go with pizza could be bread sticks, beans or cowboy beans, salads (potato, pasta, etc.), mac-n-cheese, any type desserts, or really anything (Hikers are burning the carbs daily so they enjoy good homemade foods which they don't get too often on the trail.) We also have a table for individually wrapped snacks (granola bars, etc.) for them to take to eat as they hike. We also need people to help set up tables, chairs, canopies (and to take down and clean up afterwards), people to help serve, work at the snack table, and work at the prayer table to take requests and pray with the hikers. Anyone working may also eat with the hikers. It's a great opportunity to make new friends, encourage hikers, and share Christ with them. Many of of the hikers have ways to follow them online so you may be able to keep up with them and encourage them as they continue the journey to Maine. We will be buying drinks, ice, eating utensils and paying for pizza ingredients so financial contributions are also a way to participate in this ministry opportunity. Many of our Association churches have participated in this ministry in past years. We are hopeful they will continue and that more churches will be a part of this ministry event. TO YOUR HEALTH

When my church came to join the Holston Baptist Associate several years ago I was informed that I needed to "carry my weight" by participating in some capacity. Just that previous year two of our pastors had suffered heart attacks. In light of this, I offered to be a clergy health point person (even though I would experience a heart attack a few years later). I obviously have no medical degree, but I do have a great interest in maintaining good health. I consult with doctors and nurses to provide responsible information for our association. It is up to you to choose your own course of action and consult your own medical providers. Soon, I shall retire from my church after nearly twenty years at Colonial Heights Baptist Church. It has been good and the fellowship of HBA has been sweet. This will be my final TO YOUR HEALTH column.

Our bodies are called the temples of the Holy Spirit. We are but jars of clay to carry around the very presence of God Himself. The temple must be cared for responsibly as stewards of God's good work in and through our lives. Neglecting our good health needs is neglecting the ministry of the Lord. It can limit our work and create a hardship on our family and our church.

We provide a poor example to our people when we ignore good health practices and set ourselves up for diabetic consequences, heart attacks, strokes and such. Too often even good practices cannot protect us from the inevitable, but being lazy or blinded to caring for our bodies only compound this journey of life. We need to stay in close contact with our family physician, nurses, nutritionists, exercise consultants and pharmacists. You cannot ignore diabetes and heart disease. You will die too soon or be debilitated. The word for us all is INTENTIONAL.

Keeping our weight in check is critical to overall health. We do not need to look like a professional athlete, but we do need to be intentional. If we have type 2 diabetes we must make the many adjustments to fight this condition for a longer, enjoyable life. A heart healthy diet can save your life, your ministry and your time with family. But we must be intentional.

You can do this by the grace of God and a commitment of the will. I will be cheering you on as you take this wonderful journey to good health.
